



PAGE GRANT

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- A student of color and/or American Indian
- A Minnesota high school graduate
- Be enrolled full-time at a Minnesota post-secondary educational institution
- Willing to complete a minimum of 50 hours of volunteer service with K-8th grade students

IMPORTANT DETAILS

- No GPA requirement
- Non-U.S. citizens are encouraged to apply
- Current college students are welcome to apply

WHAT IS A PAGE GRANT?

- Scholarships ranging from \$2,500-\$3,500 per year
- Helps you pay for a certificate, 2-year, or 4-year program
- Annually renewable
- Application Window: January 1, 2026 - April 1, 2026

HOW TO APPLY

- Submit a Page Grant application online
- Respond thoughtfully to four essay questions
- Provide one letter of recommendation from a teacher
- Provide parents' or guardians' 2024 or 2025 IRS tax form
- Provide a copy of your high school & college transcript (if applicable)

PAGE GRANT APPLICATION ESSAY QUESTIONS

The essay portion is the most important part of the Page Grant application. The scholarship review committee uses these responses to determine whether an individual will be selected as a Page Grant recipient. Each response to the prompts must be a minimum of 250 words.

1. Tell us about yourself and explain how your educational experience has impacted you and shaped your personal journey up to this point. In your answer, include details about your upbringing and pinnacle moments from your past.
2. Besides financial support, tell us how receiving the Page Grant aligns with your primary values and how it would help you achieve your pursuit of a post-secondary degree and career goals.
3. Describe a specific instance in which you actively contributed to your community or prioritized the needs of others over your own. In your answer, explain the situation, the actions you took, the ending result, and what you learned.
4. All recipients of the Page Grant are required to complete a Service to Children Project where they volunteer as tutors, mentors, and positive role models with children in grades Kindergarten through 8th grade. If you were selected as a recipient of the Page Grant, where would you volunteer and why? What qualities and traits will you bring to your Service to Children Project to help children view education as important and higher education as a possibility?
